Building officials and contractors concerned with the rounded appearance of the concrete filled fabric form should be reassured that it is a temporary form and will provide the critical footing width and depth when installed according to installation instructions.

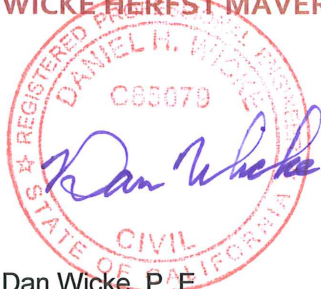
Despite the footing's unusual shape, it is no different than conventional engineered footings or code specified footings with sloped top surfaces. Fastfoot® provides the shear and punching shear requirements for the empirical depth and width requirements of Section 1809.7 and Table 1809.7 of the 2009 International Building Code.

The use of fabric for footings also meets the requirements of ACI 318 section 6.1 – Design of formwork and ACI 347R "Guide to Formwork for Concrete", which encourages and allows contractors to take responsibility for the use of forming materials that provide the most economical solution to their forming problems, whilst meeting the contract requirements of the design or project they are building.

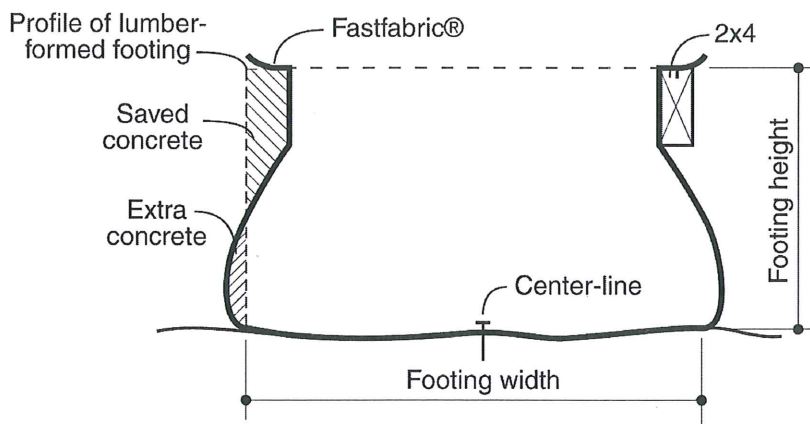
